UPDATE FROM TCC CHAIR, STEVE MCSWIGGAN

Much of the focus of TCC members since the last Newsletter has been spent on various consultations and responses from the community regards energy infrastructure projects in Tealing.

A quick recap of that is that the SSEN application for a 220-acre substation at Balkemback Farm garnered the single most objections to any planning application to Angus Council in their history. Well over 1800 objections were lodged - many from current and former residents of Tealing and surrounding areas. A large amount of effort was put in gathering information from a variety of landowners, residents and environmental professionals so that TCC could put in a strong objection document outlining the reasons why this proposal should not go ahead in its current format when it eventually comes to a full Angus Councillors committee meeting. To be clear not one of the many hundreds of approaches to TCC were in favour of this project and associated plans in our village.

It is anticipated the planning determination will happen between now and June. We hope that TCC and other invested parties are given the opportunity to present an oral submission at the planning meeting where the decision on SSENs substation is to be made. Four years of over 100 trucks travelling to the site daily seven days a week for 12 hours a day as per SSENs own submission is a horrific disruption for many residents' enjoyment of their life in this rural area.

This month also saw the final public consultation for the OverHead Line (OHL) routing from Kintore to Tealing. SSENs plan, as expected takes the shortest route, oblivious to locals concerns about proximity to housing, use of good land and disruption to farming locally. Their planned route will see the view up to Craigowl Hill peppered with an array of super pylons of over 200ft irreparably changing the landscape around this local landmark across the Sidlaw hills. SSEN have been deaf to alternate routes proposed should the substation go ahead at Balkemback.

We trust that the local councillors recognise the strength of local opinion on this and refuse the application so that a public enquiry is forced as to the need for it in the first place. There is much to be debated on the evidence for the whole planned industrialisation of over 1000 additional acres in Tealing now that the UK Government have removed their effective embargo on windfarm and energy generation closer to market in England.
